Pastor's Wessage

Dear friends,

We're at the inevitable point in the season when most of us, on a daily basis, either hear (or declare ourselves) "I can't believe the summer is almost over!" The irony of the phrase is somewhat comical because, well, if time is anything, it's predictable. Yet it always seems to take us by surprise!

While summer will of course be with us a bit longer, I want to use this space to begin sowing some seeds for you. Seeds for you to think on, but more importantly, seeds for all of us to be praying over. (In keeping with the fact that more of Jesus' parables had to do with seeds than any other topic, it's more than fitting for that to be our continued metaphor as well.) That said, any wise farmer or gardener knows the importance of taking a good hard look at the soil before visualizing potential harvests – and not only the soil, but the many variables that influence its quality and longevity as well!

As we move into and through autumn, we will have opportunities to ask some honest questions together of our "soil" and how we are being called to be the best, most faithful stewards of it. In the time between now and then, I'm asking each of you to really think about the elements that comprise our "soil," (e.g. our current congregation - and its characteristics; the building itself - its size, location, and condition; our resources and assets; current cultural trends, etc.). The list is going to be LONG and it will undoubtedly consist of both challenges and attributes, but please begin jotting items down. And if an item raises questions or thoughts for you, keep pulling that thread and write down where those questions lead!

And most importantly, understand that this taking stock and beginning to plan for the future of TUPCNK is not an exercise for current Session members only! If this church and its ministry is important to you, then *your voice is important too*. I hope you will prioritize being a part of our fall planning discussions, once dates are determined. Look for them in Sunday bulletins, as well as forthcoming newsletters.

In the meantime, brothers and sisters, keep the faith! "And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds" (Heb 10:24).



Between our new parking lot sign and a new round of forthcoming t-shirts, you'll probably be seeing our church logo a bit more often. We found the explanation for its colors and design that Eric Yeamans submitted with it years ago when he first came up with the logo:

"This variation takes an abstract approach to representing people. The figures represent outreach, while the color and form focus your eye to the center which forms a cross in the negative space of the logo. The color represents energy, excitement, and celebration by being unified by one similar aspect, worship. The vibrant colors are also a representation of the diversity that the church represents."

And there you have it. All these years later, it's still every bit as meaningful!
