Pastor's Message



Advent greetings to you, friends!

Most of you will receive this newsletter before you've given thanks for your turkey and green bean casseroles the *first* time, not to mention the second and third times! But as you know by now, Advent is quite literally on the cusp of Thanksgiving this year, which may be making your head spin a little faster than usual

the closer we get to Christmas. But I'm going to issue the exact same reminder I did this time last year: Christmas does not, in fact, come immediately on the heels of Thanksgiving!

There IS time and space between the two - not only in which to catch your breath, but to reorient yourself and your household. In the rhythm of the Church year, this holy time and space (Advent) is known as a season of preparation. For centuries, people of faith have used the four weeks preceding Christmas to prepare not only for the Christ-child, but to allow their hearts to experience solace in the deepest possible way our human form can fathom. There are indeed names for that solace: Hope. Peace. Joy. Love. These are the themes that Advent refocuses us on year after year.

For sure, being mindful of each theme is a wonderful act of self-discipline and self-care - but if you're anything like me (and I'm guessing you are!), with each January 1st, I'm occasionally left wondering where I missed the boat. I intentionally limited my shopping and spending; I politely turned down at least half the invitations I received. I planned meals well in advance to eliminate kitchen stress. But the season came and went and I'm left wondering why or how it passed me by!

To be completely transparent with you, it took me more than five decades to realize what was happening: even though I had finally learned to simplify and slow down during Advent, my focus – honestly – was still on everything and everybody <u>but</u> Christ. Oh, we read about Christ, we sing and pray about Christ, we light candles and put up Christmas trees to honor Christ, but how do we tease apart all the actions we take that are *about* Christ...versus Christ himself?

Friends, I wish I had a tried-and-true answer kit for you, complete with instructions for ensuring you meet the Christ child this year. But I suspect the answer(s) for one of you may be quite different for another of you. I also suspect you will know it, unquestionably, when it happens. My hope and my prayer for each of you this season is that your hearts "feel strangely warmed" - to use John Wesley's phrase - by the gift of the Christ child himself, and that you will experience this gift as part of your faith family. If you have been away but are wanting to return, this is truly the best time of year to do so. I can assure you, you will be welcomed back with open arms! Likewise, if you have siblings, neighbors, or cousins, etc. who you've been hoping will come back – now is the time to remind them that the best way to predict the future is to create it together.

May God bless your heart and your home this Advent season,




WOMEN'S CHRISTMAS TEA Sunday, December 8
