If you ask Google to define *the ties that bind*, you'll probably get something like the following in return: "the shared beliefs, experiences, connections, or bonds that unite several people, creating a sense of community or belonging." But if you were to ask *me* for a symbol of those ties that bind, I would take you to the chapel in the church and show you something very special: a beautiful walnut piano.

On a snowy morning in January, a team of movers carefully rolled the piano out of a truck that had come from Redstone Highlands in Murrysville; more specifically, it had come from the living room of Mrs. Marge Landfried, who wanted it to come – more than anywhere else – to the church she still loves so very much, The United Presbyterian Church of New Kensington.

Most of you know that prior to my coming here, I had been the chaplain at Redstone for nearly ten years. Not only did Marge (and her beloved husband, Rev. Mark Landfried) quickly endear themselves to me all those years ago, but Rev. Lisa Dormire - also employed by Redstone - and I became fast friends over shared connections. And what an honor, in 2014, when Marge entrusted Lisa and me both with Mark's memorial service.

By 2015, when TUPCNK needed a part-time pastor for several months, both Marge and Lisa encouraged me to answer that call. In doing so, all those ties that had bound Marge and Lisa to TUPCNK from so long ago graciously began expanding to accept me as well. I recall one specific example of how those ties never stop extending, but also, never diminish with the passing of time. Bonnie DeLancey, who had served on the search committee that called Mark Landfried to TUPCNK in 1982, was not well herself during the summer of 2015. When Marge heard this news, she told me she'd like to visit Bonnie - so away we went. Escorting Marge down the hall of Bonnie's care home felt a little surreal (since I was doing so on behalf of both TUPCNK *and* Redstone simultaneously), but seeing the sheer joy and disbelief on Bonnie's face when Marge entered her room was nothing short of a holy moment. Only a few weeks later, I would be in the humble position of celebrating Bonnie's life - by way of her memorial service at TUPCNK.

Even after my time at TUPCNK concluded in late summer of 2015, and I returned to Redstone full-time, those ties continued to grow and show up in some lighthearted ways. I often went on the Redstone trips that Lisa coordinates and remember silly moments with Kathryn Whitacre, Karen Grillo, and Marie Davis – of all places – outside the baseball stadium in Chicago! Kathryn, Karen, Althea Joseph and I have shared meals at countless Cracker Barrels in different states, and not long before I returned to TUPCNK in 2023, Lisa and I got to enjoy a lovely lunch with Nancy Deiseroth and Mamie Nixon at the Greenbrier in WVa!

You can see in the photo (bottom right) that some special folks from TUPCNK took some of this same fellowship to Marge herself at Redstone – and she was, indeed, incredibly happy to see them! Throughout the years, Marge, of course, has been very aware of the many changes that have occurred at TUPCNK since Mark and she served here decades ago. Nonetheless, she would always tell me, "they are good, *good* people." She knew, and still knows, what it means to be connected (and blessed) by the ties that bind. May her piano - which Mark gave to her as a surprise anniversary gift many years ago - always remind *us* of the same!
